



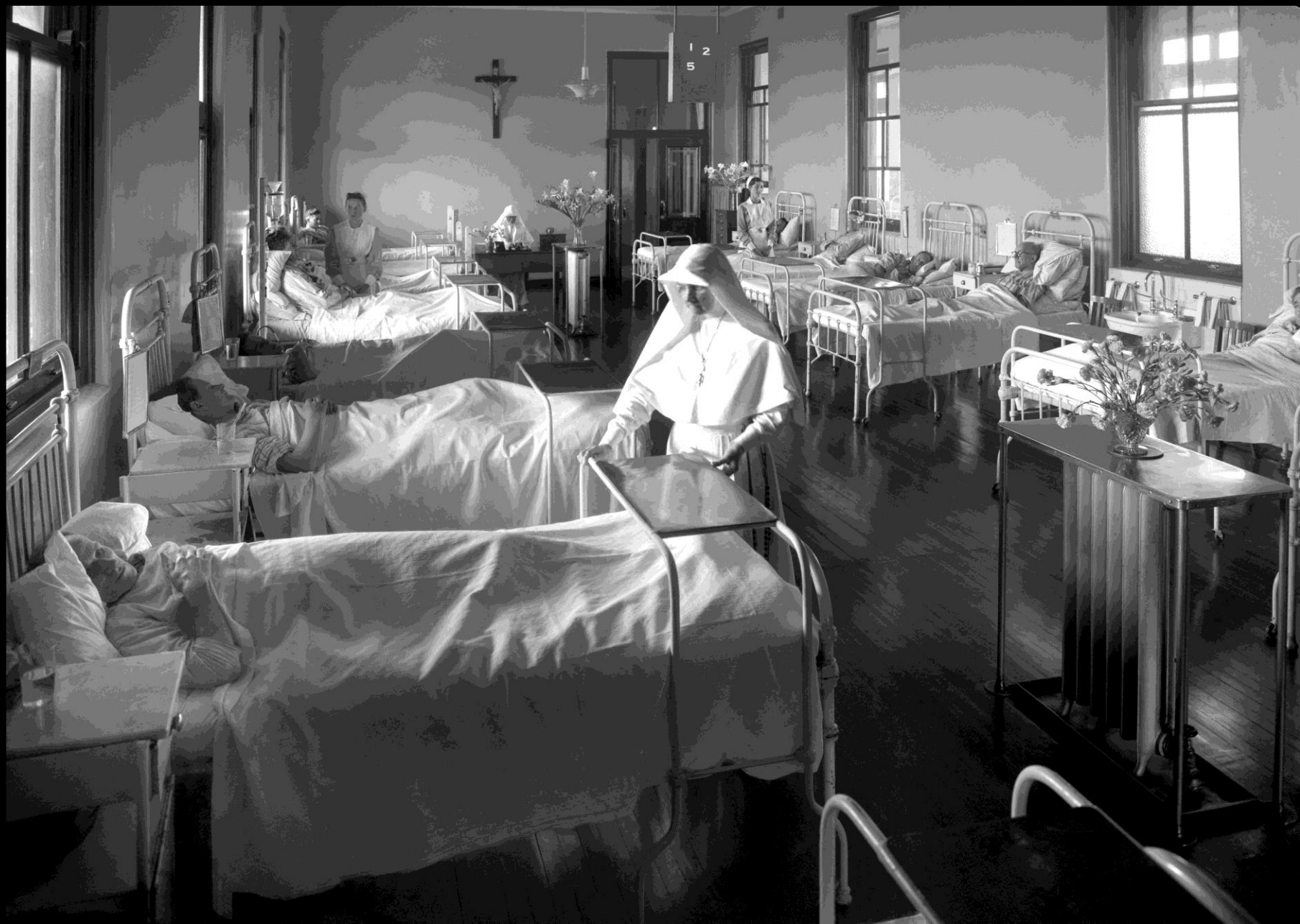

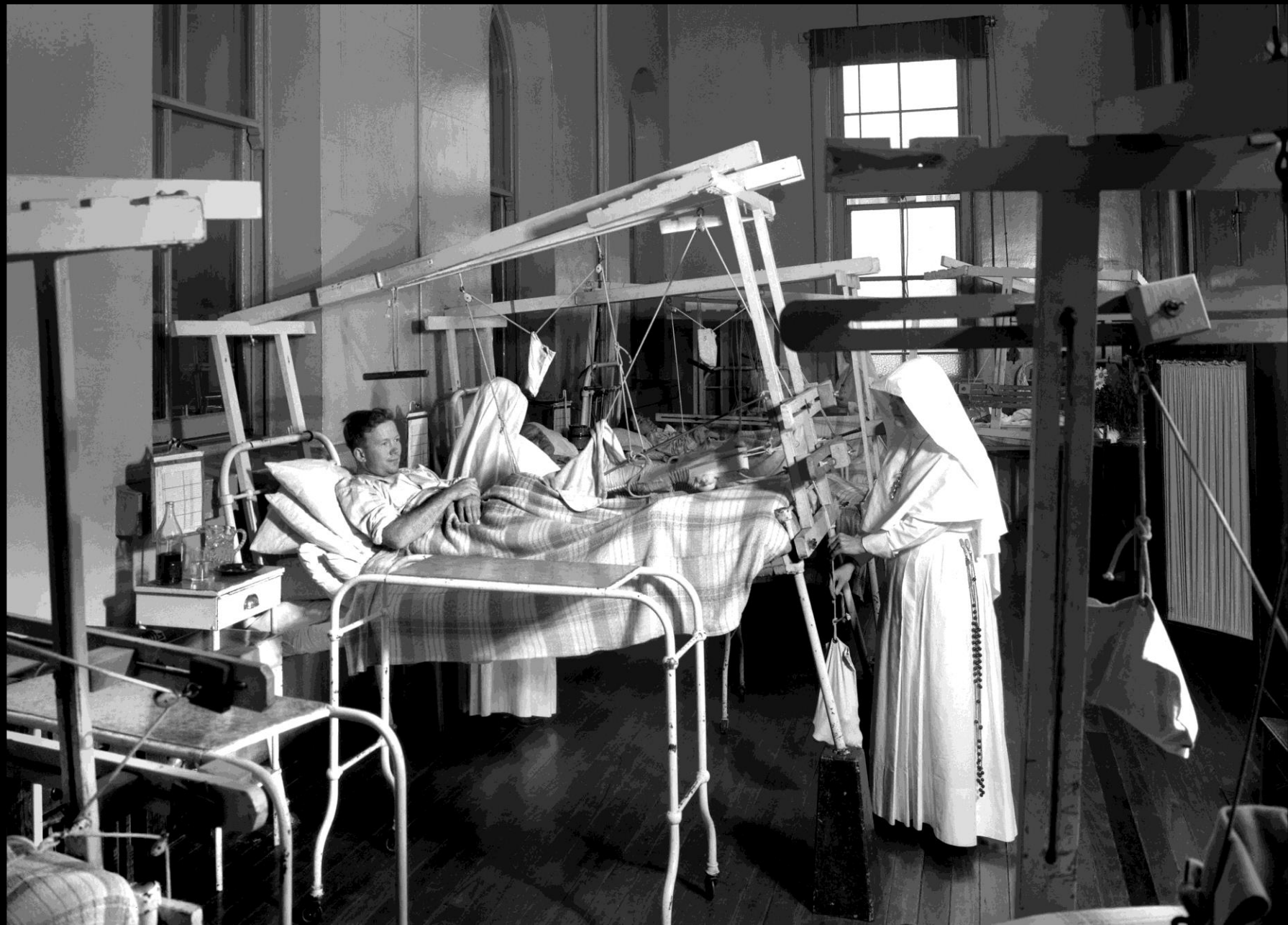
It has highly developed specialist units in most areas of medicine and surgery including Heart / Lung Transplant, Bone Marrow Transplant, HIV/ AIDS, and also a Palliative Care Unit and a Rehabilitation Unit situated in the Sacred Heart Building. It is affiliated with the University of New South Wales and the Australian Catholic University and has associations with other universities.

Physiotherapy Department

The Physiotherapy Department is an integral part of the hospital and has an 80 year history of providing services to the patients of St. Vincent's.

We now have physiotherapists across most areas of the hospital from the acute areas of Emergency and ICU to the sub-acute areas of Rehabilitation and Palliative Care to Outpatient Services such as Musculoskeletal Outpatients and Cardiothoracic Ambulatory Care.

Physiotherapy Department (cont)

Physiotherapy is part of Allied Health. The Physiotherapy Department consists of:

1. Physiotherapy Manager
2. Teams Leaders: there are 4 Team Leaders in the areas of Acute Wards, Musculoskeletal, Cardiothoracics and Sub-Acute
1. Senior Physiotherapists in Intensive Care, Orthopaedics, Musculo-skeletal Outpatients, Palliative Care, Wards, Stroke Unit, Haematology/Oncology, Aged Care, the Medical Assessment Unit, Cardiothoracics/ Cardiopulmonary Transplant, Emergency, Stroke Unit, Cardiothoracic Ambulatory Care, Rehabilitation Inpatients, Day Hospital/Rehabilitation Outpatients, Palliative Care and Palliative Care Community
2. Junior Physiotherapists who rotate across the areas of Neurology, Rehabilitation, Musculoskeletal Outpatients, Intensive Care and Palliative Care
3. First Year Graduate Physiotherapists

Unit Descriptors – Intensive Care

The Intensive Care Unit (ICU) treats patients who are critically-ill and requiring life-support treatment.

There are 3 physiotherapists providing care across 20 beds. Some of these are high dependency beds i.e. patients who may not require life-support or intensive care treatment but have higher needs than ward patients

The Senior ICU physiotherapist is responsible for coordinating the physiotherapeutic care in ICU and there are two junior staff members; a Level ½ rotator and the FYG physiotherapist

The physiotherapists provide blanket coverage and assess and treat all the patients in the unit. The physiotherapists provide respiratory care for the patients, particularly the intubated and ventilated patient and provide early mobilization and rehabilitation

Cardiothoracics/ Transplant

Xavier 10 encompasses the clinical areas of Cardiothoracic Surgery, Cardiopulmonary Transplant, Thoracic Medicine and Cardiology and treats patients from these groups.

There are 3 physiotherapists providing care across 68 beds. 10S is predominantly Cardiothoracic Surgery, Cardiopulmonary Transplant and Thoracic Medicine whilst 10N is mainly Cardiology and pre-Cardiopulmonary Transplant.

The Senior Cardiothoracic/Cardiopulmonary Transplant physiotherapist is responsible for coordinating the physiotherapeutic care on 10S and there is one junior staff members; the FYG physiotherapist.

The Acute Care Student Unit Supervisor is responsible for coordinating care on X10N and is responsible for the thoracic medicine patients on X10S. However, the physiotherapists work very closely together

The physiotherapists provide blanket coverage and assess and treat all the patients in the unit. The physiotherapists provide respiratory care and mobilization/rehabilitation for the patients

Musculoskeletal Outpatients

The Musculoskeletal Outpatient Department provides outpatient services for a range of musculoskeletal patients including those of an insidious onset (General MS problems- shoulder pains, neck pain, lower back pain, hip pain, knee pain, foot/ankle pains, chronic pain) and those of a traumatic onset (Post surgical- ACL, rotator cuff, Achilles tendon repairs, etc,. THRs, TKRs, Post acute onset- ED)

General Surgical Ward

The General Surgical Ward treats a range of general surgical conditions including gastro-surgery and Head and Neck surgery. The General Surgical Ward is on Level 8 South of the Xavier Building

The FYG physiotherapist is the sole therapist on the ward and works under the supervision of the Senior Wards Physiotherapist

The physiotherapists provide blanket coverage on the ward.

They are responsible for assessing and treating all patients where appropriate and working with the multi-disciplinary team to facilitate good outcomes and timely and appropriate discharge

Sacred Heart Rehabilitation

Sacred Heart Rehabilitation is a 22 bedded unit under the care of 5 consultants.

We operate on a blanket referral system providing 6 full days of service and also provide an out-patient service servicing patients upon discharge and rehab-appropriate patients from the community.

Staffing comprises of 1 Senior Inpatient Physiotherapist, 2 Grade 1/2 Physiotherapists, and 1 First Year Grad

We work very closely with all members of the multidisciplinary team aiming to facilitate optimal recovery to enable patients to return home or to advocate to the appropriate care facility.



Secondment Hospital

Mater Hospital: a Private Hospital also under the St Vincent's Health Australia banner, the Mater is a 230 bed hospital that provides elective surgery. The physiotherapist mainly works in elective orthopaedics but may also cover other types of post-surgical care
